

The home on the property is a stone manor that was built circa 1792. Strolling across the property you will find a large pond with a small dock. Greenhill also includes barns and cattle as well as a small caretaker home.

Sugarloaf Mountain Vineyard is located just 25 minutes outside of Washington, D.C. making them the closest vineyard to the city. Sugarloaf covers a total of 92 acres of farmland, 19 acres of which are mature vineyards. Their tasting room was opened in 2008 and formally dedicated in January of 2009.

Seven Oaks (Septenary Winery)





Seven Oaks Farm was placed on the National Register of Historic Places and is now considered a Virginia historic landmark. It is located in Greenwood, Virginia just outside of Charlottesville. Spanning 100 acres, this beautiful property is home to 15 acres of vineyards, four tenant houses, several barns, a gym, stables and a greenhouse.

The estate itself stands as 6,870 sq. ft. of finished Greek revival architecture. Beneath the outstanding view of the Blue Ridge Mountains, you will find seven varieties of grapes in the now mature vineyard.

Seven Oaks sold in the spring of 2014. The new owners plan to create one of Virginia's most elegant wineries, and have renamed the property Septenary Winery.

White Hall



Thite Hall is located a mere 13 miles from Charlottesville, Virginia in Albemarle County. The vineyards are host to a wide variety of varietals or grapes, including but not limited to, Petit Verdot, Pinot Gris, Chambourcin, Gewürztraminer, Muscat



and Touriga Nacional. The vineyard, totaling 45 acres, stands alongside the estate at approximately 800 feet in elevation. The wine tasting room also serves to showcase White Hall's production process.

The Winery at La Grange is located in Haymarket, Virginia at the base of Bull Run Mountain just 40 miles south-west of Washington D.C. The farm consists of 22 acres, 8 of which are vines. The grapes grown are used to make wines including Cabernet Sauvignon, Petit Manseng, and most recently Petit Verdot. A manor dating back to 1790 has been renovated and is now used as their tasting room.




Valley Road Vineyards

Its close proximately to Front Royal make it an excellent place for day-trippers and weekenders seeking a tranquil place to put their feet up and enjoy the view of the mountains.

Ekholmen







A modern and secluded Tuscan villa situated on 165 rolling acres, Ekholmen boasts spectacular views of the Blue Ridge Mountains and is ideally located just 20 minutes from Charlottesville, Virginia. The land is partially wooded with open fields covering about 65 of the 165 acres. Previously there was a seven-acre vineyard that yielded five grape varieties for many years. A five-minute drive takes visitors to the incredible vistas and scenic overlooks of the Skyline Drive and the Blue Ridge Parkway.

The new owner of Ekholmen intends to create an exceptional winery on the Virginia mountaintop plateau of this perfectly situated estate.

Stone Mountain Vineyards



A beautiful winery and vineyard located in Central Virginia between Charlottesville and Harrisonburg. This winery was first established in 1998, and has been family owned and operated. Stone Mountain is an established vineyard with award-winning wines and a devoted clientele. Along with a four-and-a-half acre vineyard, there are 70 additional acres of gorgeous rolling hills that can be used for additional cottages, houses, or farming.

Wisdom Oak Winery



Charlottesville. The vineyard and winery alike are cozy and intimate and are considered a "best-kept secret" by those who discover it. This quaint property is found off the beaten path and has been tended to with great care and passion. The tasting room itself can be found in a remodeled home, which gives the winery a feeling of intimacy that just cannot be found among the larger wineries.

Blackthorne Inn



Cocated in Upperville, Virginia, only 50 miles from downtown Washington, D.C. The Inn is currently owned by the esteemed Easton Porter Group, a luxury hospitality company. There is currently an upscale events barn under construction that will be located 300 feet from the property line. The Easton Porter Group is committed to protecting the open space and woodlands, and their new design preserves 98.5% of the land.

Blue Acre Farm



Land 110 miles from Washington DC. Continually built and renovated from 1981 to 2007, this incredible 4,000 square foot residence was built to be energy efficient while taking in the incredible views of the Blue Ridge Mountains. There are a total of 190 acres on this property, 89 acres of pasture and 101 acres of forest, which were perfect for planting four and a half acres of vineyards on the property.

San Gabriel Farm



A vineyard that is waiting for its next revival, this Madison County Farm has 10 acres of vineyard trellises ready and waiting for new vines to be planted. The Winery has absolutely amazing views, and can hold about 30 guests. On the farm, you will find a spring-fed mountain stream that divides the property. Several spectacular building sites can be found on the high plateaus for either a hunting lodge or a permanent and very private home.

Chestnut Oak Vineyard



ocated in Barboursville, just a few miles outside of Charlottesville, Virginia. This Monticello AVA winery has chosen to specialize in two specific wines: Cabernet Franc & Petit Manseng. With only the two grapes to focus upon, Chestnut Oak has proven to highlight the two individually and give visitors a chance to truly get a taste of the influence of Virginian terroir from year to year.

Vista Ridge Vineyard



The vineyard was established in 2000 and is comprised of quality vinifera: Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, and Cabernet Franc yielding between six and seven tons of wine grapes each season. Located near recreational lakes and mountains, with beautiful sunset views. Additional cleared land on the 18.64 acres makes the vineyard easily expandable toward the west.





Rocklands: An 18th century home situated on 2,000 acres of gently rolling hills. Rich in Virginia history, this home is now registered as a Historic Landmark by both the Commonwealth of Virginia and the U.S. Department of the Interior.



Edgewood: A fine old Virginia house sited on 453 acres overlooking the Blue Ridge Mountains and the scenic Rapidan River. Built in 1853, the house is a fine example of Greek Revival architecture set in a group of towering hardwoods.



Bellemonte: A certified organic cattle farm west of Staunton, in the heart of the Shenandoah Valley, with a large 1840 white brick manor house and panoramic views to the west of the nearby Allegheny Mountains. The farm has gentle topography and good soils with long road frontage on both the front and the rear of the property.



Sherwood Farm: Located just 14 miles from Charlottesville, Sherwood Farm consists of 674 beautiful acres of both pasture and wooded lands in the rural Carters Bridge area of fine estates.



White Hart Country Estate: Hidden amidst 353 acres of rolling Virginia countryside in northern Albemarle, this English country manor rests beneath the shadow of ancient majestic oaks. The 8500 square foot residence is constructed with superb quality materials and craftsmanship.



Verulam: A brick, 8,600 square foot mansion built in 1941, Verulam offers nearly a square mile of beautiful gardens, huge oak trees, and 550 acres with the perfect balance of open meadow and hardwood forests.





Fox Horn: An elegant country estate at the base of the Blue Ridge overlooking mountains and valleys from its elevated hilltop site. One of the most picturesque settings in Albemarle County with panoramic mountain and pastoral views. Equestrian facilities Inc. 80 x 200 indoor arena, outdoor riding ring, paddocks, and run-ins. Long frontage on Stockton Creek.





Blue Ridge Farm: A magnificent 12,000 square foot manor home on 124 park-like acres with extraordinary mountain vistas. Charming guest houses, pool, stables, two large ponds and classic landscaping in an area of historic estates.



Esmont: One of Virginia's most classic Georgian homes set on a high knoll in the Green Mountain section of Albemarle County. The estate has substantial facilities for horses and would be well suited for other livestock as well.





Seven Oaks: Located in beautiful Greenwood, and a Virginia Historic Landmark "of statewide and national significance." Situated on a prominent knoll in Albemarle County with commanding views of the Blue Ridge Mountains.



Stone Ridge: A grand Georgian Colonial manor house offering 8,900 square feet of living area on 1,250 acres on the shores of the James River. This home site has broad views of the Blue Ridge Mountains and the James River Valley.



Red Horse Farm: A classic Virginia farming estate built in 1800, overlooking 513 rolling acres with fantastic views of the Blue Ridge and Southwest Mountains. The two-story brick country home reflects the long-lost craftsmanship of that bygone era.



Mountain Hollow: Situated in the beautiful Greenwood estate area of Albemarle County. The turn of the century home is situated under a canopy of large trees, shady lawns, and beautiful gardens.



Windholme Farm: A 235-acre equestrian estate featuring an exquisite 18th-century manor home with several charming cottages and superb horse facilities. Set amidst beautifully rolling meadows and magnificent hardwood forests.





Windemere: A grand brick home built in 1981 in the tradition of the Deep South. Situated on 290 acres of primarily rolling fields and meadows, fenced for horses and other livestock. Within ten minutes of Charlottesville.



Woodley Farm: Situated on 200 beautiful acres of open, rolling fields which surround the main houses and stables. This site of two manor homes was chosen for the spectacular views as well as for the shade of the huge oak trees.





Slate Hill: Hand-crafted from a unique original design combining traditional Virginia farmhouse style with an elegant touch of Swedish charm. When Slate Hill was featured in Southern Living, the design was instantly lauded for its graceful blend of motifs and its comfortable open spaces and elegant attention to timeless detail. The slate for the foundation, fireplace chimney, and floors, was quarried from the property. Property includes a three bedroom cottage and four barns.





Grace Hill: A beautiful and meticulous restored Federal brick manor is located at the base of Jump Mountain. Many modern improvements and upgrades have been added to the estate. The house is situated on 40 acres with a stable, guest house, two offices and renovated barn. This property is ideally located close to Lexington.



Three Chimneys: This unique historic home circa 1800 has spectacular Blue Ridge Mountain and Rockfish River views. The 32-acre property is ideal for livestock or horses. Located in Nellysford near restaurants, nightlife, and much more.



Blue Ridge Mountain Lodge: From its position on a plateau 1,000 ft above the surrounding countryside and 1,700 ft. above sea level, this property commands astounding views of near and very distant mountains and the rolling meadows and fields of the farms below.







Hatton Grange: This incredible grand 19th Century Manor House was once home to a Virginia Governor. The property includes several guest cottages, barns, dependencies and 133 acres of mature wooded areas and beautiful rolling pastures, lakes, ponds, and coveted long frontage on the James River. Breathtaking southwest views of the River Basin against the distant backdrop of the Blue Ridge Mountains enhancing the graceful charms of this historic Riverfront Plantation.



Hidden Valley: Beautiful Equestrian property adjacent to many miles of riding/hiking trails in Wintergreen and National Forest. Part of the property is open pastures as well as a sizable wooded portion.



Historic Stone Country Estate: This renovated 1890s stone house, with a backyard pool and all the modern amenities, is perched on a high knoll with incredible mountain views. Stone walls embrace the pool in a delightful natural setting with huge Yoshino and weeping cherries. Thousands and thousands of spring and summer flowering bulbs adorn the gardens.



Whiskey Ridge: A beautiful historic home situated on over 83 acres of land. Located in beautiful Free Union less than 20 minutes from Charlottesville. The property has a charming c1830 house that is nearly 3,000 sq ft, reconstructed along the Moormans River the serenity and views are perfection. The property also included a guest cottage, barns, and stable.



Fosters Branch: This modern architect-designed home makes an ideal family home or family compound, with a total of almost 6,000 square feet in the main residence, as well as three additional guest houses. The 54-acre property covers the entire mountaintop offering total privacy, peace, and solitude, with stunning and spectacular views on the hilltop.





Indian Creek: The Inn offers five charming bedchambers all accompanied by a private bath. On the grounds is a lovely three bedroom, two-and-one-half bath Villa over the Stable. This is a popular choice for families and guests traveling with horses. The Villa also offers amazing views of the Blue Ridge Mountains from the deck.





McDaniels: 375 fascinating acres of Albemarle County prime farmland, with a historic log home, wonderful panoramic Blue Ridge Mountain views, and extensive river frontage. This productive farm is just a few miles from Charlottesville yet feels as if it exists in centuries past.





Pagebrook: An elaborate country cottage on 440 very private acres in historic Keswick, Virginia. This equestrian estate is one of the most private estates in the area. The property is the perfect mix of open and wooded land with huge, mature trees and rolling meadows.



Lyle Lane Flint Hill: Historic Manor Home overlooking three large lakes on 75 acres of land. Wonderful near & distant mountain views over rolling meadows. The property even includes a 2,200-foot airstrip! Marvelous setting only 15 minutes to Warrenton, and 60 minutes to Washington D.C.



Montpelier: One of Virginia's most historic homes and properties. It has witnessed both the Revolutionary and Civil Wars and remained essentially untouched, in regards to its 18th-century interior, exterior, and its surrounding pastoral landscape of over 170 acres. This Montpelier should not be confused with James Madison's Montpelier in nearby Orange County.






